All the children visited Common Farm this week, walking from the Footprint. The days were part of the exciting work the National Trust are doing at Common Farm. They are looking to manage the land in a way that balances food & farming with nature, biodiversity and sustainable land management. We walked from St Catherine's around the edge of Orrest Head to Common Farm. Along the way we identified different parts of the landscape and pieced them together like a jigsaw. We took a closer look at some of these pieces,

comparing different types of fields, what different land was used for and how the farming and wildlife are interrelated. We then explored how changing one affects the others and the children imagined how they would like the land to look in the future.



We also carried Cowslip plants over to a rough meadow and managed to plant 75 of them on a south facing slope before heading back over the fields and woods to St Catherine's. We are so grateful to be part of this amazing project.



The children who are preparing to celebrate their First Holy Communion in a few weekends are almost fully prepared. They spent their session this week in church and asked lots of questions about the two special sacraments they are to celebrate in May. Massive thanks to Mrs Murray who volunteers her time to prepare the children for this joyous occasion.

A letter has been sent home inviting you all to join the Parish for the churches Jubilee celebrations on Fri 14th June at 18.30. We really hope you can join us and your child will be able to represent St. Cuthbert's. The Bishop is celebrating Mass, it will be a wonderful event and a very special one for our Parish community.

Year 3,4,5 and 6 are enjoying their weekly swimming sessions. KS2 are back in the woods on Tuesday. Please remember PE kits every day. We welcome local artist Nicki Smith into school on Monday to continue working with KS2 around the topic 'Echo Capture',
